Oklahomans continue to contribute to the national totals of injuries and deaths of roadway workers and emergency responders. The issues of how traffic incidents are managed are known to play a part of these contributions.

Traffic Incident Management, TIMS, consists of a planned and coordinated multi-disciplinary process to detect, respond to, and clear traffic incidents so that traffic flow may be restored as safely and quickly as possible. Effective TIM reduces the duration and impacts of traffic incidents and improves the safety of motorists, crash victims and emergency responders.

River Monsters: Collaborative Management of Fish Kill Response
